Goals

This seminar provides the opportunity to explore and discuss concepts on coaching and supervising students in interprofessional learning. Participants acquire tools and methods to effectively develop and implement courses and assessment methods for interprofessional competences. They learn to manage the quality of interprofessional courses in health and social care.

Session themes

Constructive alignment and outcomes-based education as necessary condition for effective IPE, The use of ICF as an essential element in interprofessional training, Training coaches and tutors in interprofessional coaching, Measuring and monitoring student's perceptions in interprofessional training, Interprofessional training with public health problems and innovative technology, cases and intake handling in training interprofessional competences, Quality assurance of interprofessional education.

Trainers

The experts are from leading institutions having a long tradition and built-up expertise in inter-professional education: Tiina Tervaskanto-Maentausta and Minna Manninen (Oulu University of Applied Sciences), Bianka Vandaele and Nadja Brocatus (Artevelde University College), Giannoula Tsakitzidis and Paul Van Royen (University of Antwerp), and Andre Vyt (University of Ghent). The experts have authored chapters in the volume *Interprofessional Education in Europe: Policy and Practice* (2015). Also the IPEQS toolbox (*Inter-professional Practice & Education Quality Scales*, 2018) will be used in hands-on exercises.

Registration

The number of participants is limited. Participation is guaranteed when registering before March 30th (50€ is added to later registrations). Payment is to be received before April 30th. Applicants need to contact isabelle.delariviere@arteveldehs.be. The fee for non-members is 400€. Staff members of institutions who are member of COEHRE or EIPEN pay 300€. If institutions are member of both COEHRE and EIPEN there is a reduced fee of only 250€. Staff of low-income countries benefit an additional 50€ reduction. The fee covers participation, documents, lunches, and a dinner. There is no refund when participation is cancelled. Participants need to cover their own travel and hotel arrangements.
